GOOD TO BE GREEN BEHAVIOUR SCHEME

We have recently shared our updated Good to be green behaviour scheme with you to look at and let us know any

comments/feedback. We haven't

received any feedback , so just to clarify a few points-

The aim of the scheme is to promote positive behaviour and attitudes to learning- this is why positive dojos are worth at least 2 points. Minus dojo points (worth 1 point each) are given to highlight to the children any behaviour that is undesirable- this is usually low level disruptive behaviour such as too much talking, calling out, making silly noises etc... Receiving a minus dojo acts as a reminder to the child not to repeat that behaviour again, helping them to learn from mistakes. Parents should not need to question every minus dojo. As explained, they are an aid to encouraging expected behaviour.
